

MARTIN LUTHER KING DAY OF SERVICE 20191

1. The Young Orators' Program (Philadelphia)

The Young Orators' Program is designed to help students learn public speaking, a skill critical to most law practices. This year, we have the unique opportunity to work with students at the Philadelphia Juvenile Justice Services Center (PJJSC), a Philadelphia youth detention center. To commemorate Dr. King's legacy, we will reintroduce the students to excerpts from some of his most profound speeches and explore the powerful themes of justice and social change through Dr. King's rhetoric. Volunteers will facilitate discussions in smaller groups of students to consider the themes of Dr. King's speeches and give the students tools to become effective advocates themselves. The students will then recite Dr. King's speeches or deliver their own, improvised speeches to the group.
