As an advisor to several teams over the course of New Jersey's medical marijuana program expansion, Rich has represented teams at community forums, and in presentations to municipal officials considering changing their zoning framework to permit cannabis-related uses.

While in law school, Rich received the Henry J. Raimondo Legislative Fellowship from the Eagleton Institute of Politics, where he received in-depth training from the Office of Legislative Services and hands-on policymaking experience in the New Jersey Legislature. Following law school, Rich served as a law clerk for the Hon. Douglas H. Hurd, P.J.Cv., Presiding Civil Judge for the Mercer County Superior Court.
