As Chair of Archer's Health Care Law Practice Group, Mr. Fogg concentrates in representing health care providers in regulatory and compliance matters as well as in complex transactional matters. Prior to entering private practice, Mr. Fogg served as the Director of Licensing and Certification at the New Jersey Department of Health. In this role, Mr. Fogg was responsible for overseeing the enforcement, regulation, and development of licensing requirements for nearly 1100 health care facilities in the State of New Jersey. Mr. Fogg also directed the Office of Managed Care, served as an executive assistant in the Office of the Commissioner, and as assistant director of New Jersey's Certificate of Need and Health Planning program. Mr. Fogg also has extensive governmental and private practice experience in mental health and addiction services matters.

Mr. Fogg authored the national practice guide "Nursing Home Regulations" for the Thompson Publishing Group, covering the survey, certification, and enforcement regulations governing skilled nursing facilities throughout the country, and served as its editor-in-chief of its monthly newsletter service for over 15 years. He lectures frequently on health care regulatory matters and has authored numerous articles.
