

More NJ Case Law on LLCs Would Aid Attys, Litigants, Biz

In a recent article for *Law360*, Archer partner Gianfranco Pietrafesa, a member of the firm's Business Counseling Group, highlights the lack of New Jersey case law interpreting the New Jersey Revised Uniform Limited Liability Company Act (NJ-RULLCA). Since LLCs are the most widely used business entity in the state, the limited number of published opinions creates uncertainty for attorneys, litigants, and businesses seeking clarity on key governance and statutory issues.

Gianfranco emphasizes the importance of published opinions in providing predictability, consistency, and guidance, and notes that unpublished opinions, while instructive, carry limited precedential value. He also reviews the role of New Jersey's Complex Business Litigation Program and the challenges posed by the scarcity of case law in both trial and appellate courts.

The article underscores the need for more comprehensive, published opinions addressing NJ-RULLCA to better serve the state's legal and business communities.
