

## Jeffrey M. Scott Addresses Rutgers Law Class on Civil Rights

Jeffrey M. Scott, a Partner in the Philadelphia office of Archer, P.C., recently spoke to a group of students at Rutgers University School of Law in Camden as part of a panel on "Preventing and Remedying Police Misconduct."

Scott, along with representatives of the Women's Law Project and the Philadelphia Police Advisory Commission, shared his expertise with Rutgers Law Professor Sarah E. Ricks' class on Civil Rights. Formerly an attorney with the City of Philadelphia Law Department's Civil Rights Unit, Scott handled hundreds of federal civil rights cases involving police pursuits, allegations of false arrest, excessive force, state-created danger claims, failure to protect claims and municipal liability. He spoke to the law students about measures an organization such as a police department can take internally to prevent and minimize problems, such as policy changes, training and education.

In addition to his expertise in police administration, wound ballistics, forensic medicine, forensic economics, and vocational rehabilitation, Scott also has specialized knowledge and experience in social work administration and practice, developed while representing the City of Philadelphia Department of Human Services during his time with the city Law Department.
