



# William Isele Discussed End-of-Life Care Issues at Stockton State

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**William P. Isele**, Esquire, of Archer, P.C., recently spoke on legal issues involved with end-of-life care at the Southern Jersey Ethics Alliance (SOJEA) conference on the campus of Richard Stockton College in Pomona, NJ.

The conference, titled "A Troubling Abundance of Care: Over-treatment at the End of Life," took place on Monday, May 12, 2008. Professionals and students in the fields of medicine, social work and health education, as well as clergy, participated in a discussion of end-of-life issues and appropriate palliative care. Highlights of the day were presentations on cultural, religious, medical, legal and communication issues affecting medical treatment. Isele, Of Counsel in Archer's Princeton office, spoke on mitigation strategies, resources for legal considerations and unexpected barriers that can arise when planning for care at the end of life.

In 2007, Isele was honored by the New Jersey Hospice and Palliative Care Organization as "Public Servant of the Year." He is the author of two books on health care law.
